Repayment relief measures for UniCredit Bank's clients affected by the floods

In order to support its clients who were affected by the floods, that destroyed numerous households, land and facilities, causing landfalls, UniCredit Bank introduced repayment relief measures aimed at easing the repayment of their loan obligations. These measures are referring to bank's clients who live in flooded areas and thus were directly or indirectly endangered.

UniCredit Bank will provide clients which are using any of bank's loan products and who suffered damage to their households, or are not receiving salaries due to the damage sustained by their employer, or have lost a close family member in the floods, moratorium for 6 months period. During the six-month moratorium, payment of principal, calculation of regular and default interest rate will be suspended, without any further costs. In addition, regardless of the loan repayment period, clients will be offered to extend the repayment period by 6 months.

On the other hand, clients, users of bank's credit cards, will be enabled to repay the full amount of the debt, incurred until June 1st of this year, in 12 equal monthly instalments, without interest. For those who decide for the revolving method of repayment, bank will allow them to repay during the next year, minimum amount of 5% of the principal per month, without calculation of interest on the full amount of the debt.

Clients, coming from the flooded areas and thus entitled to loan facilitations can apply, by August 14th, for repayment relief measures in one of UniCredit Bank's branch offices.
