### **UniCredit Bank additionally improved its m banking for three operating systems - iOS, Android and Windows**

Keeping pace with the challenges of technical development, UniCredit Bank is continuously working on improvement of its mobile banking. So now, thanks to upgraded software solutions, access to this service is possible through tablet devices with Android (minimum 3.0) and iOS (minimum 5.1.1.) operating systems.

In addition, striving to provide its customers the highest possible level of security when it comes to electronic banking, UniCredit Bank has recently introduced application Mobile token, which represents another simple and quick way to perform financial operations, and which allows clients to communicate with their bank, regardless of where they are and to make payments regardless of branches' working hours. Namely, in order to run the application it is necessary to use PIN which user independently creates and which is known only to him.

Thanks to M Token application, customers have the possibility, using a one-time password, to access Online bank, while they QR code is necessary to sign payment orders, as well as to independently perform the settings within the application itself. Mobile token can be installed on all models of mobile phones that support Java, iOS, Android, and Windows operating systems, but also on tablet devices. The internet connection is not required for this application and it is available in roaming too. The application can be installed only once on one device, or mobile phone or tablet, and thus it is protected from copying and instalment on other devices. The activation code can be used only once. The data related to accounts and PIN code does not remain in the device.
